## **COLONEL J. CHAD PHILLIPS**

Col Jeremy Chad Phillips serves as the Commander of the 138<sup>th</sup> Maintenance Group, Tulsa Air National Guard Base, Tulsa, Oklahoma. He is the Senior Officer responsible for organizing, training and equipping over 450 Maintenance Professionals. He provides command, control and oversight of the maintenance functions of a 21 primary assigned F-16CM fighter wing executing a 2,600 sortie and 3,700 hour annual flying program.

Col Phillips was commissioned through the Air Force Reserve Officer Training Corps at the University of Tennessee at Knoxville in 1994. He served as a project engineer at the 92<sup>nd</sup> Civil Engineering Squadron before beginning Specialized Undergraduate Pilot Training in 1995 at Vance AFB, Oklahoma and graduated in 1996. After completing F-16 upgrade training at Luke AFB, Arizona in 1997, his first operational assignment was the 35<sup>th</sup> Fighter Squadron, Kunsan AB, Republic of Korea where he served as an Electronic Combat Pilot. Col Phillips' next operational assignment was the 55<sup>th</sup> Fighter Squadron at Shaw AFB, South Carolina, where he served as Flight Commander and Instructor Pilot. At his third assignment, the 510<sup>th</sup> Fighter Squadron at Aviano AB, Italy; Col Phillips was selected for the USAF Weapons Instructor Course. Following graduation from



Weapons Instructor Course, he returned to Aviano and became the 510<sup>th</sup> Fighter Squadron's Weapons Officer. Col Phillips was invited to return to Nellis AFB, NV where he served as Chief of Scheduling, Chief of Training, and Assistant Director of Operations for the 16<sup>th</sup> Weapons Squadron. His last active duty assigned was at the 603<sup>rd</sup> Air and Space Operations Center in Ramstein AB, Germany as the Senior Offensive Duty Officer and Chief of Standardization and Evaluation. In 2009, Col Phillips joined the 125<sup>th</sup> Fighter Squadron, Oklahoma Air National Guard in Tulsa, Oklahoma as an instructor pilot. Col Phillips has served as the the 138<sup>th</sup> FW Chief of Safety, as well as the 138<sup>th</sup> Operational Support Squadron Commander.

Col Phillips is a command pilot with over 3000 hours in T-37, T-38, and F-16. He has flown over 100 combat sorties and over 350 hours of combat time in the F-16. He has participated in Operation Northern Watch, Operation Southern Watch, Operation Iraqi Freedom and Operation Freedom's Sentinel.
